

COVID-19: What you need to know

- COVID-19 can spread by coming into close contact with a person who has been infected via respiratory droplets when they cough, sneeze, or talk
- COVID-19 can also be spread by touching infected surfaces and touching your face.
- With cases on a greater rise, it is advised to reduce social contact to a minimum and avoid exposure when possible.
- To reduce infection risk, stay home to avoid exposure and wear a cloth facial covering on your nose and mouth in public.
- Additionally, maintain a distance of at least 6 feet when interacting with people outside of your household.
- Wash your hands often for at least 20 seconds.
- There are about 50 various vaccinations currently undergoing animal trials, and about 20 undergoing human trials.

Clinic Operations: TELEMEDICINE

- A telemedicine approach is in use via
 Doximity a HIPPA compliant resource –
 to attend to patients.
- Patient visits have been largely successful with the aid of our student and physician volunteers.
- Patient medications are being refilled, as needed, and patients have the ability to put in requests for blood pressure cuffs and face masks.
- In-person clinic visits began on November 7th, 2020.
- All medical students must now be tested for COVID-19 every 2 weeks.

Clinic Operations: Statistics

- 163 patient encounters via telemedicine and phone calls
- 240 volunteer hours via telemedicine
- An estimated \$400 spent for patient blood pressure cuffs
- An estimated \$4000 spent on patient medications



FOR DONORS

- SRFC is now partnered with Cass Clinic to provide patients with flu vaccinations.
- We are currently in the works of reaching out to local news stations and newspapers to increase the patient pool and get word out about the telemedicine clinic.
